

Photographing Sea Lions How to Make Better Wide-Angle Images

President's Message

I had a great trip to the Philippines last month. During the trip I did 37 dives. This count includes fourteen blackwater dives that were an exciting new experience for me. For my first blackwater dives, I managed to get some nice images. You will hear and see more about the blackwater dives when Tom, Dennis and I present at the July HUPS meeting. For this article I want to discuss my "regular" day time dives during that trip.

On every trip I take I strive to get better images than I did on my previous trip. To do this I look at the images from my previous trip with a critical eye. I review the bad images as well as the good images. I analyze my bad images to determine the most common faults. I know if I can correct my common faults I can up my "keeper" rate. Increasing my number of keepers will increase my odds of getting winners.

My previous trip was an August trip to Cozumel. That trip resulted in way too many images with poor focus. I k new by concentrating on getting properly focused images I would increase my number of keeper shots. Prior to the

Philippines trip I made sure to re-adjust the diopter on my camera viewfinder to match my aging vision. I also planned to use my focus light more, especially on tiny subjects or when the subject was in the shadows. Using a focus light helps me ensure my subject's eyes are in focus. I decided to put extra effort into being sure my subject was in focus in my viewfinder before I took the shot. I knew I had a bad habit of moving my housing as I squeeze the shutter lever. This very slight movement is enough to shift the focal plane of the image. I concentrated on not moving my camera as I squeezed the shutter lever. These efforts did help. I managed

to get more properly focused shots. A couple of my favorite images from the trip were of tiny subjects where sharp focus was critical.

So, trying to reduce my bad shots did result in more keepers. I also had a plan to make more of these keepers true winners. Earlier I mentioned that prior to a trip I would review both good and bad images from my previous trip. When I reviewed the good images I tried to determine what I could do to make the good images even better. After reviewing images from my last few trips I noticed a couple things. It seemed that I needed to make more eye contact with my subjects. During my recent dives I kept reminding myself to get in front of my subjects and get down on their eye level. My review of older images also showed that many of my good shots were slightly underexposed. Very rarely did I have an

overexposed image. That meant I had room to crank my exposures up a bit, so I did. Making these changes resulted in some images that I love.

The whole point of this article is to encourage you to learn from your old images. Review past

images before a trip to determine what you did poorly, what you did well and what you can do better in the future. If you need help determining what can be done to improve your images just ask! I, and many other experienced HUPS members, would be happy to help review your images. Make your next trip your most photo productive trip ever!



2020 Photo Contest Themes

Month	Themes	Description
Jan	Diagonal Composition	A diagonal composition is employed to arrange elements in an image based on a diagonal line.
Feb	Eels	There are lots of eels out there. They are pretty easy to spot; think, "snakes with gills".
Mar	Blue water	Any primary subject as long as the background has a nice blue color.
Apr	Large swimmers (> 4 feet) - not people	A fish or critter that is swimming with a length > 4 feet. Examples: grouper, tarpon, sharks, stingray, manta ray, dolphin, moray eel, and big subjects are what you are shooting for.
May	Odd-shaped bottom dwellers	Infrequent-swimmers. Frogfish, crabs, flounder, scorpionfish, toadfish, batfish, lizardfish, crocodile fish. If it is a bit odd looking and spends most of its life on or in the sand or reef, it probably qualifies.
Jun	Nudibranchs & Worms	Again, this is pretty specific but you may need to check your critter ID book if you're not sure. Worms can fool you sometimes. Who would think that something that looks like a colorful Christmas tree ornament could be a worm?
Jul	Hawk fish, Drums, Triggerfish	A theme that gives you multiple choices of fish. This theme gives you up to 3 possible choices of fish families. So come on and submit a photograph or two to the contest. If not sure, check your fish id sources or ask the PC.
Aug	Crustacean	Just like it says look it up in the book (crabs, shrimp, lobsters, barnacles, etc.). When in doubt Wikipedia can help you out.
Sep	Natural light	Shooting ambient light means you are using the sun as your light source. Shooting with ambient light means less camera drag, as strobes can be left on the surface. The lighting of the photo will be more even, which is ideal for large subjects such as large reefs or schools of fish, silhouettes, or large wrecks.
Oct	Blennies and Gobies	Some of our favorite tiny guys. The ones that like to hug the reef, hide out in holes, or build their nests in the sand. If you aren't sure if your little guy (or guys) qualify, look it up in your critter ID book or ask the opinion of one or our ID experts.
Nov	Polka Dots/Fish with Spots	A spot, a small round or roundish mark differing in color or texture from the surface around it. The most common subjects underwater are known variously as boxfishes, coffer fishes, cowfishes and trunkfishes.
Dec	Best of HUPS	NOVICE, INTERMEDIATE, ADVANCED, and CREATIVE contests: First place winners from each month's Novice, Intermediate, and Advanced categories will be entered automatically for judging. The Creative category lets you enter anything you want as long as you do the photography and any special editing.



The Texas Gulf Coast Council of Diving Clubs (TGCC) plans to award one College scholarships (1 @ \$500) during 2020. This scholarship is given in memory of Jack Allyn, Greg Grimes, Jean Himes, Anne Millioud, Clint (Dwight) Moore, John Petty, Michael Szewczyk and Dick Zingula; deceased members of our dive community. It is also awarded in recognition for support of the TGCC Scholarship Program by Alicia Grimes, the Houston Underwater Club, the Houston Underwater Photographic Society and Linda Petty. The purpose of this award is to support the members who support the dive clubs in the Texas Gulf Coast area. The award will be paid by TGCC directly to the college towards tuition.

Eligibility Rules:

- 1. Scholarship applicant must be a college undergraduate or graduate student attending college in 2020, or a high school senior that has been accepted to college in 2020.
- 2. The applicant, the parent(s) (biological or through formal adoption), or the grandparent(s) of the applicant, must be an individual member of TGCC or a member of a TGCC member club with dues current in 2020.
- 3. Application (see other side) must be received by the TGCC Donations Committee prior to **June 30, 2020**. TGCC will review all completed applications on July 2, 2020.
- 4. Applicant shall have the high school/college furnish a transcript of grades, courses and class standing.

Scholarship General Guidelines:

- 1. Scholarship decisions of TGCC are final.
- 2. Scholarship winner is expected to keep TGCC abreast with his/her progress in college.
- 3. TGCC reserves the right to not award a prize depending upon the number of entries and qualifications of the applicants.
- 4. A personal interview with members of the TGCC Scholarship Committee may be required prior to awarding this scholarship.
- 5. Confirmation will be by e-mail. Make sure phone and e-mail data provided is current.
- 6. TGCC is offering this scholarship as a reward to TGCC members, TGCC member and associate clubs or the children of these members to thank them for supporting TGCC's efforts in promoting safe sport diving. The committee will take into consideration the applicant or applicant's parents involvement in TGCC and member clubs and/or the diving community in general throughout the year.
