As Monica alluded to above, it's getting harder and harder to find a HUPS member that hasn't jumped onto the GoPro bandwagon. When we went to Bonaire last year, it seemed that half of the divers in the water at any time had one of these diminutive dynamos pointed at anything that was moving. OK, that's a good start for sure. However, between the memory card and a "full-goose" presentation, a lot of extra work is required. That's what Monica is doing to help jump-start our members into taking video to the next level.

I am now one of those band-wagon riders. My GoPro with assorted housings, digital LCD backs, red filters, macro attachments, and a variety of not-very-expensive gadgets is now on my table waiting for my next dive trip to the Cocos Islands. I can't wait to see how it all turns out. I really hope that what I capture is going to be good enough to justify the ramp-up efforts in learning to edit my stuff into something worth viewing by others.

So, to all of you GoPro-ers (and other video types), the challenge is out there. Let's get moving. Shoot those videos. Buff up your video editing skills and let's see a lot more from you at meetings.

taken of Anne with her family and friends.





HUPS' President's Page-Why Travel with HUPS

I want to encourage you to attend our August Meeting featuring A Night at the Movies. I also request each of you complete the travel questionnaire found in this Newsletter. Your Board of Directors is submitting this questionnaire to determine if a club sponsored trip this spring or fall 2015 to the British Virgin Islands (BVI's) is a trip the Club is interested in. We have researched the pros and cons of a liveaboard vs. a land based excursion. We considered Dive BVI, as the dive operators, if a land operation is decided upon. If a live aboard is chosen, we researched and decided the best choice was a sailing trimaran – Cuan Law, the largest trimaran in the world. You may want to visit the websites for the Cuan Law, Dive BVI, Guavaberry Spring Bay Vacation Homes, a house rental company having 3 BR home rental selections near "the Baths", and the tourism sites for the BVI's. A cost analysis is also attached to the questionnaire to help you decide if you are interested in a sea vs land based trip.

HUPS is a not for profit club organized to promote the interest and participation in underwater photography and videography. What better way is there than travel to obtain those photographs members see and enjoy monthly. Travel gives us an insight into others' lives, social and political issues, education or lack thereof in the places we visit, and an opportunity to have social interaction with the group of people we travel with. HUPS has over the years organized trips on its own or in conjunction with travel agencies and has travelled to such places as Bonaire, Bali, the Philippines, Cozumel, Cayman, and many other spots in both the Caribbean and the Pacific. Our individual members have travelled to the 4 corners of the earth taking photographs and just enjoying travel and meeting new people.

Your Board of Directors has tried to plan trips in order to appeal to all of our members. The most recent trip was organized by island Dreams but led by a HUPS member, Jesse Canselmo. It was well attended by both HUPS members and Island Dreams participants. Our upcoming, scheduled club trip is to Bonaire and is being led by Jim and Debbie Mensay. We also tried, based upon the discussions as to how best serve the membership, to schedule a cruise but apparently not many signed up for such a venture.

Our trips are geared to assist the member's interests in underwater photography and videography. The trips also let you become better acquainted with the person who sometimes sits next to you at our meetings. You might be surprised how much you may have in common with someone once you go on one of HUPS' trips and really get to know some of the members. Members in our club come from different backgrounds and have many unique qualities to offer to the group. You will find a HUPS member ready to assist you or refer you to someone with an answer to any issue you may have regarding photography or videography. Travelling with HUPS is an adventure and one we welcome you to participate in.

Your BOD picked the BVI's for a spring or fall trip, depending upon the answers to the questionnaire in this newsletter, based upon the fact that so few of our members had actually dived that part of the Caribbean. In addition to the BVI's, there are in the same area the USVI's and the Spanish Virgin Islands, Culebra and Vieques, to explore at some later date.

There are discussions underway as to a trip to the Cayman's using the Cayman Aggressor or a land based operation on Grand Cayman. The land based operation is being considered as it might appeal to those of you who want to take families and/or non-diving friends and still be able to go on a diving trip.

As to the proposed trip to the BVI's, we need your input to determine if this is a trip the club as a whole is interested and would participate in or has no interest in going to this location. We plan to prepare a similar questionnaire in September as to other locations to determine the Club's interests in other dive destinations.


