

HUPS Presents: Cecilia Clementi - Diving in Spectacular Raja Ampat Dennis Deavenport & Cecilia Clementi



Join us at Bayland Community Center as we are treated to Cecilia Clementi talk on Raja Ampat. It's always a real pleasure for me when one of our newer HUPS members offers to prepare a presentation on one of their recent trips. Unless you've been hiding under a rock for the past 6-10 years you probably know that the Raja Ampat region of eastern Indonesia is about as hot a place to dive as anywhere on the planet.

Recently, I had the pleasure of having Cecilia over to our house for some lessons on how to prepare a presentation and how to do it using ProShow Producer. We had lots of fun with the program and Cecilia's intelligence and familiarity with computers made it super-easy for me. To put it bluntly... she just gets it. We share a number of common interests including diving, scientific research, and pottery so there was more than just ProShow to discuss. It was a very fun evening for me and I'm sure that her innate creativity and attention to detail will generate a presentation that will be exceptional. I don't plan to miss it and you shouldn't, either. Show up early and join the pre-party that we always have at meetings. Afterward, join us at Don Carlos for Mexican food and more conversation. See you there.

In Cecilia's own words:

About the show: I am going to present pictures taken during my trip in Raja Ampat last December. The liveaboard boat we were on was the Dewi Nusantara. We departed from Sorong (far western New Guinea), toured north and south Raja Ampat, and got back to Sorong after 11 days at sea. The marine life in Raja Ampat is so rich and diverse that it was difficult every day to decide whether I should use a wide-angle or macro lens. It seemed that there were always great subjects and opportunities for both settings on almost every dive. I started the trip using more the wide-angle as I was fascinated by the incredible sea-

scapes, corals, and schools of fish. As the days went by, I found myself leaning more and more to the macro lens because the small stuff in Raja Ampat is really amazing. Soon, I started using my ± 10 diopter to get super-macro shots and that was a lot of fun.

My equipment is a Nikon D600 in a Nauticam housing with two Sea&Sea YS-D1 strobes. I mostly used a Sigma 15mm f/2.8 fisheye lens for my wide-angle, a Nikon 105mm f/2.8 as my macro lens, and a SubSee \pm 10 diopter when getting super-close macro shots.

About myself: I am originally from Italy. I was born and raised in Florence and moved to the States 17 years ago to pursue my career as a scientist. I am a theoretical biophysicist and a professor at Rice University where I lead a research group. We model protein dynamics and

try to understand its implications on biological function and disease. I travel a lot for work giving lectures or presenting my research at conferences around the world or at other scientific collaborations. In my (very rare) spare time when I am not working or diving, I like to do pottery on the wheel in my garage that I have transformed in a pottery studio. I have been diving for about 25 years. I started diving back in Italy when I was in college. I discovered tropical diving when I moved to the States and now I try to take at least a couple of trips every year to locations like Indonesia or the South Pacific. I am a diving instructor with Houston Scuba Academy here in Houston and I enjoy teaching diving and meeting other local divers. I started with underwater photography three years ago and I have quickly become completely addicted to it.

2015 TGCC MEMORIAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS (In memory of Greg Grimes, Anne Millioud, John Petty and Michael Szewczyk)

The Texas Gulf Coast Council of Diving Clubs (TGCC) plans to award four College scholarships (1 @ \$2,000 and 1 @ \$1,000 and 2 @ \$500) during 2015. These scholarships are given in memory of Greg Grimes, Anne Millioud. John Petty and Michael Szewczyk, deceased members of our dive community. They are also awarded in recognition for support of the TGCC Scholarship Program by Alicia Grimes, the Houston Underwater Club, the Houston Underwater Photographic Society and Linda Petty. The purpose of these awards is to support the members who support the dive clubs in the Texas Gulf Coast area. The awards will be paid by TGCC directly to the college towards tuition.

Eligibility Rules:

- 1. Scholarship applicant must be a college undergraduate or graduate student attending college in 2015, or a high school senior that has been or will be accepted to college in 2015.
- 2. The applicant, the parent(s) (biological or through formal adoption), or the grandparent(s) of the applicant, must be an individual member of TGCC or a member of a TGCC member club with dues current in 2015 or on the HUC club roster in 2012.
- 3. Application (see other side) must be received by the TGCC Donations Committee prior to **June 30, 2015**. TGCC will review all completed applications on July 9, 2015.
- 4. Applicant shall have the high school/college furnish a transcript of grades, courses and class standing.

Scholarship General Guidelines:

- 1. Scholarship decisions of TGCC are final.
- 2. Scholarship winner is expected to keep TGCC abreast with his/her progress in college.
- 3. TGCC reserves the right to not award a prize depending upon the number of entries and qualifications of the applicants.
- 4. A personal interview with members of the TGCC Scholarship Committee may be required prior to awarding this scholarship.
- 5. Confirmation will be by e-mail. Make sure phone and e-mail data provided is current.
- 6. TGCC is offering this scholarship as a reward to TGCC members, TGCC member and associate clubs or the children of these members to thank them for supporting TGCC's efforts in promoting safe sport diving. The committee will take into consideration the applicant or applicant's parents involvement in TGCC and member clubs and/or the diving community in general throughout the year.




The rules are pretty simple:

- 3) The topics are open to the imagination but they need to be diving related. Some topside video and images are OK but we are an Underwater Photographic Society so think "wet".
- 4) The shows need to be kept to 2.5 and 3.5 minutes.
- 5) They also need to be rendered in a format that is generally acceptable for nearly all computers. More on that later, I'm sure.
- 6) Entries need to be in my hands no later than Friday night before the meeting.
- 7) Once the entries have been submitted, I will forward them to the judges for their ratings and comments.

May the best person win. But really, winning is secondary to learning how to edit your video and make it into something that others will want to see. I will try to show all of the entries at our Monday night meetings. If we don't have enough time for everyone, then we may have to limit it to the top three finishers. The Flower Garden Banks NMS Expansion process is again underway. Take note of the March 5th and 11th public meetings on this matter. (The full content from Sanctuary Superintendent, GP Schmahl is below. Here is a more concise version) -

*The Flower Garden Banks National Marine Sanctuary (FGBNMS) Expansion process is again underway. On Tuesday, February 3rd, the Office of National Marine Sanctuaries (ONMS) will publish a "Notice of Intent" (NOI) to solicit public input and prepare a Draft Environmental Impact Statement for

the expansion of the FGBNMS. This review is based on the recommendations

contained within the Sanctuary Expansion Action Plan, which is a component

of the FGBNMS Management Plan, published in April 2012. The core of that

Action Plan is the recommendation made by the FGBNMS Advisory Council (map $\,$

attached indicates the extent of expansion).*

*The public comment period will be open for 60 days from the date that the

NOI is published . As part of the public scoping process, 3 public meetings are scheduled. They will be held from 6-8pm at the following locations:*




